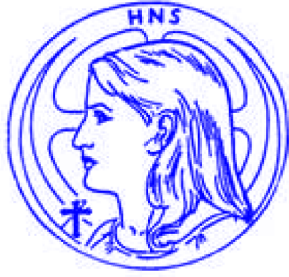

There were no new members present to introduce so Don asked if there were and any additions or changes to the minutes of November. Richard Thomas moved that the minutes be accepted as written. Richard Antolik seconded and the motion was approved.

Treasurer John Karpa reported an opening balance of \$5,394 for November in the checking account and \$3,252 in savings account. Income in November was \$2,275 from dinner ticket sales. expenditures for the month was \$1,736.. This was for the dinner supplies leaving a balance of \$5,933. Income in December was \$16 and expenditures was \$494. this was for the purchase of oil for the upcoming Fish Frys. December closed with a balance of \$5,454 in the checking account and \$3,254 in the savings account. Tom Murray moved to accept the report and John Goodwyne seconded the motion.. motion carried.

Old Business

There was no report from the Pastoral Committee since they did not meet in December.

Don reported that the Nativity Scene was taken down and stored in the shed for next Christmas. Gus was happy to report that we have a buyer for the barbeque pit. the selling price was \$750 and will be picked up this weekend. John Karpa will go with the purchaser to have the title changed. Many thanks to Gus and John. The purchase of a new fryer and food warmer

is on hold. John will purchase some time in the next month.

New Business:

Just a reminder to all members that dues are due. Richard a will be harassing everyone to collect the dues.

Fish Frys will be held on February 27, March 13, and March 27. Tickets will be \$8. Meals will be fish or shrimp or half and half, salad, Cole slaw or French fries, bread and dessert. John K will have the tickets printed. Don will pick up the signs and have the new date put there on..
