In the book of Exodus, God says: *Remember the sabbath day—keep it holy. Six days you may labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is a sabbath of the LORD your God. You shall not do any work, either you, your son or your daughter, your male or female slave, your work animal, or the resident alien within your gates. For in six days the LORD made the heavens and the earth, the sea and all that is in them; but on the seventh day he rested That is why the LORD has blessed the sabbath day and made it holy (Exodus 20:8-11).*

The early Church established Sunday as our Sabbath, distinguishing themselves from other Jews by honoring the Lord on the first day of the week: the day of the Resurrection. When we think about it, six days a week we work under strain, beset with worries, enmeshed in anxieties, slaves to material things. But on Sunday we turn our attention to the things of the spirit. The Sabbath gives us a sacred place, a reserved space: for the worship of God, for family, for inwardness and reorientation, for experience of the spirit, for meaning and values to live by.

Here we are given time: to be thankful, to be joyful, to be free, to look where we are going in life, and, if need be, to correct our compass; time to be with one another and with the Lord. On this day Jesus broke the chains of death and rose in triumph from the grave. It provides us with a window into eternity. It is a place of refreshment, light, and peace, a halting place on the road that leads to the father's Kingdom. Thank you Lord, for the gift of the Sabbath! I hope you are enjoying this gift the way God intended.
